1. Phase II Projects – Sickle Cell Anaemia and Childhood Nephrotic Syndrome-

- The DNA samples have been sent to Professors Tayo Bamidele and Santosh Saraf in Chicago for the sickle cell anaemia study genotyping.
- We have not started genotyping for the childhood nephrotic syndrome study, but we have most of the DNA except for Kano and South Africa.

2. Cohort Study-

- We are still expecting feedback from Jeff Hodjin to update the "others" diagnosis group in the monthly enrollment report.
- The cohort study monthly enrollment reporting team is in the process of updating the B6 follow-up visit numbers in the enrollment report.
- The cohort study B6 follow-up visit window is scheduled to close on the 31st of March 2026, while data cleaning continues across all the centers.
- The clinical centers were encouraged to get more cohort study participants for the B6 follow-up visit before April next year.

3. New Grant Proposals-

- We are hoping to get funding from the European Union and other potential funding organizations in the United Kingdom.
- Dr. Dwomoa is in close contact with potential collaborators, including a biostatistician and consultant nephrologist in both Germany and Amsterdam.
- Activities are underway to get the new grant proposals titled “**environmental determinants of CKD**” and the “**genetic determinants of young CKD**” developed and submitted by March 2026.

4. Committee and Working Group Reports-

- The manuscript, entitled "**Recruitment and Retention of Participants in Clinical Research in Africa: Experience from the H3Africa Kidney Disease Research Network**" will be submitted by the end of this year, 2025.
- The processing of data requests is still the top priority for the data working group.
- The manuscript for the childhood nephrotic syndrome study requires approval from some members of the committee.

- The scope of data requested by the University of Michigan will be worked out by Drs. Akinlolu Ojo and Dwomoa Adu.
